Her Legacy: Motivating and inspiring victims of assault to be strong

In her capacity as a victims' advocate for the City of Fort Collins Police Services, Britta Clay Davis helps people who have been sexually assaulted to survive a devastating situation—sexual assault or domestic violence—and emerge with strong voices to stand up to violence, belief in the power of their voices and of their rights, and the courage to seek justice.

Britta supports individuals through the process of reporting assaults, making their way through the justice system, and empowers them with hope, guidance and strength. She mentors volunteers with the Sexual Assault Victim Advocate (SAVA) program in effective, compassionate ways to assist victims of assault as they undergo the experiences of reporting and recovering from the assault.

Britta recently served on a panel during a conference of the Colorado Organization for Victim Assistance (COVA), along with other advocates for victims of assault and domestic violence, to address how law enforcement and community agencies can partner to better serve victims. Britta has twice been recognized by the City of Fort Collins as employee of the month.

Through her work with victims, Britta has touched the lives of hundreds of people and guided women toward empowerment.
